A message from Maddy...





Improving Access service

We continue to work in partnership with our 11 member GP practices to make additional appointments available in the evenings and at weekends for local people to access. The Improving Access service is available to patients registered at any one of our member practices across the city and means that we can offer more appointments between 6.30pm and 8pm on weekdays, as well as additional slots at weekends and bank holidays. Appointments may not always take place at the practice where a patient is registered because the service is delivered collaboratively by all 11 practices. It was introduced in response to feedback from patients who struggled to attend appointments during the working day and is delivered by a range of clinicians, including GPs, nurses, primary care practitioners and healthcare assistants. Together, they provide a wide range of services, from cervical screening clinics and checks for long-term conditions, such as asthma and COPD, to blood tests, as well as telephone and face-to-face GP appointments.

Please can we ask our employees, volunteers and member practices to follow Nimbuscare on social media (see the links at the end of this newsletter) and share our posts as much as possible. We're all working together across the city and the more we can spread the word about what we do, the more people will benefit from our services.





Covid vaccination service updates

We've begun vaccinating 16-17 year olds As we opened up the vaccination programme to young people aged 16 and 17 years, it was encouraging to see more than 1100 arrive for their first dose of the Pfizer vaccine within the first week. We'd already vaccinated many 16 and 17 year olds in the 'at risk' groups during the first months of the vaccination

programme as they were included in one of the earlier cohorts. Now we are reaching out to those who are classed as healthy in order to protect them and their families. These young people can walk in to the Vaccination Centre at Askham Bar or any one of our pop-up clinics. Advice on when to offer them their second vaccine dose will come later.

Sixteen-year-old Will (pictured left), who had his jab this week, is starting Sixth Form in September and is keen to avoid having to go back to home schooling. He also said he's having the vaccine to protect his grandparents. Pictured above are 16 and 17 year olds Blue, Nick, Chloe and Maddie from Tadcaster, who all came for their jabs this week.

Booster vaccine programme

Our fantastic teams are now gearing up to deliver the booster vaccination programme to people over the age 50 years from September 6 onwards. We'll share more information on how this will take place very soon.

More pop up clinics planned

More pop-up vaccination clinics are taking place this weekend at Unity Health's Kimberlow Surgery and Jorvik Gillygate surgery. Both will be held on Saturday morning (21 August), from 9am to 12 noon.

We'll be running pop-up vaccination clinics at local colleges and universities during fresher's week, as well as staging a walk-in, city centre pop-up clinic outside Boots Opticians on Parliament Street on 28 August, from 9am to 1pm. There will also be another clinic at Jorvik Gillygate Practice on Saturday 28 August, from 9am to 12 noon.




Live Q&A on Monday
