

# A message from Michelle...



Michelle Phillips (pictured) is Nimbuscare's Director of Quality and Patient Experience, and Lead Nurse. It's almost a year since the first Covid-19 vaccinations were administered by our teams at the York Vaccination Centre. One year on, we've given around 470,000 jabs, including almost 60,000 boosters and 3,000 jabs for 12-to-15 year olds in schools across North Yorkshire.

Our teams have also given around 10,000 flu jabs this winter, as well as running a host of other services.

With concerns growing nationally about the spread of the Omicron variant of Covid-19, we're making every effort to step up the roll out of the booster campaign to everyone over the age of 18 during the coming weeks.

With this in mind, we're recruiting more volunteers so, if you know anyone who might be interested in helping, please ask them to <u>email</u> us. Once an application has been acknowledged and so we can get volunteers on board as quickly as possible, they will undergo a DBS check and be asked to complete a short e-learning session.

# Can you help?

Whether you're a weekly worker at York Vaccination Centre, have not been involved for a while due to other important duties or simply haven't had the chance to work with Nimbuscare yet, we need your help now as we respond to the call to give boosters to all adults.

Our aim is to expand capacity in our Tent of Hope, where we deliver the local vaccination service, and proactively send invitations to patients. Working together to make this extra effort between now and the New Year will help us to meet the challenge and protect our local population.

### PATH service extended

The success of our Paediatric Ambulatory Treatment Hub (PATH) pilot, which operates from our Askham Bar site, has led to the service being extended until March. During the pilot phase, our teams saw more than 100 babies and children under the age of five years.

A collaboration with York and Scarborough Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, North Yorkshire Clinical Commissioning Group and Vale of York Clinical Commissioning Group, the hub aims to prevent babies and young children going into hospital unnecessarily with respiratory illnesses.

We're now taking referrals from the 111 NHS telephone service, as well as from paramedics and GP practices across the Vale of York. We're accepting children under five years with respiratory illness and/or a fever. This means that we urgently need to recruit more clinicians to work in the service.
