A day in the life of...

It was wonderful to see two members of the team who've been heavily involved in running the York Vaccination Centre from our Askham Bar Community Care Centre featured in the latest edition of the Health Watch York magazine. The feature covered a typical 'day in the life' of volunteer Trish Hughes and our Lead GP Dr Daniel Kimberling. Community heart service

Launched on 10 May, our specialist heart health service operates from our Askham Bar Community Care Centre, where we run one clinic per week.

We're working with local GP practices and York and Scarborough Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust to support York patients with long-term heart issues in the community, as they wait for further treatment.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, many York patients with long-term heart issues are currently waiting longer to be seen by a specialist team.

So far, we've held six clinics and seen more than 20 different patients. Each patient is offered three appointments with the service and, to date, five patients have been discharged with an effective and safe treatment plan in place.

We've found that people have been incredibly grateful for the intervention offered to them through this new service, which was established as part of collaborative efforts to aid the city's recovery from the pandemic.

The NHS is 74 years old!

Yesterday, Tuesday 5 July 2022, the National Health Service (NHS) marked its 74th birthday. As the NHS continues to innovate and adapt to the changing needs of each successive generation of people, here in York Nimbuscare is at the very forefront of this.

With the development of our new Community Care Centres and our commitment to working collaboratively with partners across the city to deliver quality health care services for local people within the community, I'm very proud that we're leading the way.

There's certainly no better time to say a great big thank to all our wonderful NHS staff across York and beyond for their hard work and dedication.

As part of the consultation, meetings of the council's Joint Scrutiny committees will be held throughout July, exploring the shared benefits of each strategy. All of the feedback received will inform the final development of the city's Economic Strategy and Climate Change Strategy, which will be taken to the council's Executive for approval in October 2022. The Health and Wellbeing Strategy will be approved by the Health and Wellbeing Board in the Autumn. It will also be used to help shape the council's budget for 2023/24.
