We'll also tell you more about some of the new services at Acomb Garth in future editions of this newsletter, but we're particularly pleased that the York Adult Tier 3 Weight Management service now operates from four rooms at Acomb Garth every week day, enabling patients to access support in a community setting, as well as at York Hospital. About the Adult Tier 3 Weight Management service...

Operated by York and Scarborough Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, this is a specialist 12-month programme involving a team of healthcare professionals who provide care to people who have excess weight. It begins with a period of intense education, well-being improvement and physical activity, which is followed by on-going support. During the course of the programme, patients see a dietician, physiotherapist and counsellor, but will also have access to a specialist doctor, who may be able to help them improve any health conditions they may have or adjust any medication they take to help them lose weight. If eligible, they may be able to access bariatric surgery. The programme involves both group meetings and one-to-one consultations. It's currently being delivered online, but it's hoped that patients will soon be able to attend face-to-face appointments at Acomb Garth. To gain access to the programme, patients must be referred by their GP and have to meet certain criteria.

David Locker, York Adult Tier 3 Weight Management Pprogramme Lead and Advanced Bariatric Surgical Nurse Practitioner, said: "As a team, we're really excited to bring our service into the community setting at Acomb Garth as we hope this will strengthen and promote collaboration between secondary and primary care in improving overall care for patients with weight issues."

Job opportunities


We're currently looking to recruit a Project Manager to work as part of our dynamic team, helping us to deliver effective services and working on number of key projects. The closing

The vaccination programme will begin in mid to late September, and will save patients from having to make two separate trips for their boosters. Any member practices who have not yet completed and returned their forms to us are asked to do so as soon as possible.

Patients can then expect to receive a text message or letter of invitation from Nimbuscare on behalf of their registered GP practice.

Acomb garden has special memories for York couple

York gardener Ady Johnson got quite emotional when his team were asked to do a gardening job at our new Acomb Garth Community Care Centre recently.

Ady had last visited the courtyard garden at the centre 25 years earlier, to have some wedding photographs taken (pictured left).

He explained: "My wife's grandad was a resident at Acomb Garth then. It was a centre for the elderly and he had Alzheimer's. He unfortunately couldn't come to our wedding, so my wife, Dawn, and I took our wedding to him!" Ady and Dawn were married on 27 September, 1997. They went to see Dawn's grandad, Ronald Gibson, the following day at Acomb Garth to have some photos taken with him. Ady, who works for AJT Garden Services in York, was asked to come and renovate our courtyard garden in June. He said: "We planted a tree in 2001 when he died, in his memory, in the original garden there, at the side of the building.

"When we were asked to do the garden, I had mixed emotions. I couldn't believe what a state it was in when we arrived, but I really enjoyed doing it. We'll make sure it stays looking good now."

After hearing Ady's touching story, we set aside a special corner of the garden where he and Dawn can create a raised bed and replant something in memory of Ronald.
